School plans are part of a provincial accountability framework to improve student results. Plans developed by school planning councils are connected to district achievement contracts, Aboriginal enhancement agreements and the Ministry of Education district review process. These processes collect and analyze information related to student achievement, develop and implement plans for improvement, review results and communicate with the public.
