When an incident occurs, we can all follow the **VALUE** Framework:

- V**alidate the experiences and feelings of those who have experienced racism
- A**sk all students/ staff involved, or who have witnessed the incident
- L**isten to student voices individually and in groups
- U**nderstand the impact of racism on victims
- E**ngage with empathy and compassion to build community
